

## ➤ About Pharasgaon

Pharasgaon is a tahsil in the Kondagaon district of Chhattisgarh, India. It is situated between the Keshkal Valley and the district headquarters Kondagaon. It is Located in National Highway (NH-30). Tribal groups, including the Muriya, Mariya, Gond, and Halba tribes, make up the majority of the population. Halbi and Chhattisgarhi are the languages that are most frequently spoken here.

The well-known Maa Danteshwari Temple in Badedongarh, which is located in the hills and is significant both religiously and historically in the Bastar region, is about 18 km from Pharasgaon. More than 80% of the Kondagaon district, including Pharasgaon, is covered in mix forests, with sal, teak and different varieties of tree Species.





The college takes pride in its proximity to the historic village of Alor, situated 9 km from the Pharasgaon block headquarters. The region is home to the ancient Lingai Mata Temple, located within a hilltop cave that opens only once a year on the first Wednesday of the Nawakhai festival. Deeply rooted in local belief and the Indian Knowledge System's tradition of sacred ecology. The temple is a significant pilgrimage site for those seeking the blessings of parenthood. The site attracts pilgrims from across India, preserving the indigenous spiritual heritage of the Bastar region.
